

The Arvanitia Promenade

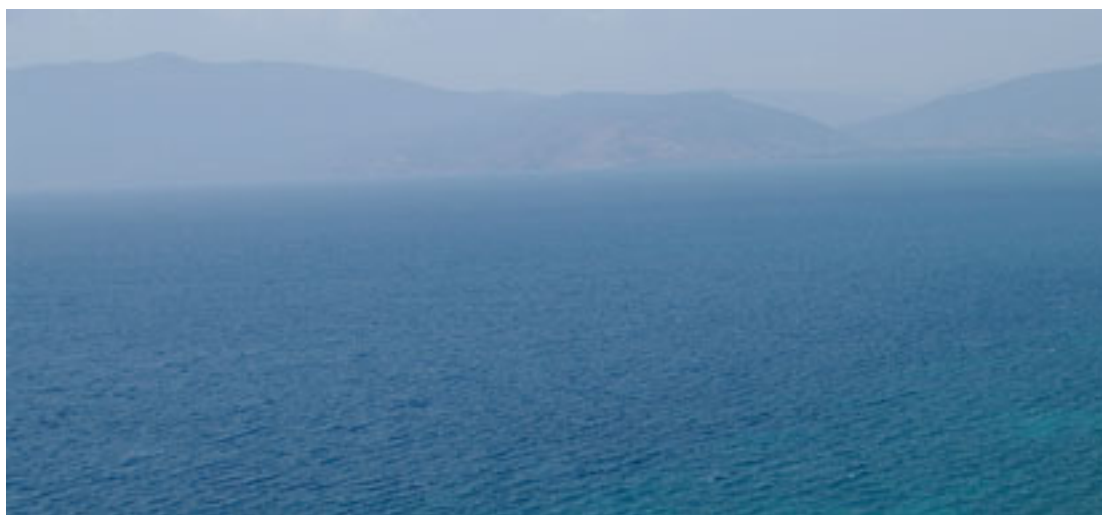

The Arvanitia Promenade is one of the most popular walks in the Malpiti shore, it is characteristically



The whole of the route is about half way through the walk. About half way through the walk, there is a small structure perched on the water. It is known locally as **Parigi**, **Pagig**, **Spilia**, or **Santa Maria della Croce** to the Venetians. It is unique.



The walk comes to an end in **Arvanitia Square**, which was from off the shore of the **Arvanitia** beach.

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In reality, the name is due to the fact that Albanians had inhabited the area before

Further down from the square are organised beach areas where one can go to relax, sunbathe and swim.

Moving on from the square, one can continue walking to the east, along the foot of the Palamidi, in the direction of a
